YOU'VE DECIDED! NOW WHAT?

The month of May is when we <u>celebrate</u> the postsecondary decisions our seniors are making. But before we can celebrate and relax for the summer, there are a lot of steps that must be completed to get enrolled for the fall. Check out some steps below!

This process can seem exciting while also scary and overwhelming. Don't forget that you have help. If you have questions about this process make sure to reach out to your college, ask your college adviser or send us an email at collegequestions@capcan.org.

ACCEPT YOUR FINANCIAL AWARD

After you submit the FAFSA, you should get a notification from the financial aid office (make sure to watch your email and the student portals) that lays out what grants, scholarships, loans, etc. that you are eligible for from the college. Make sure to log in and accept what aid you would like to receive.

SIGN UP FOR ORIENTATION

Whether this is an online orientation or one where you attend in person, orientation is a crucial part of this process. This is where you will learn how to sign up for classes, meet your academic advisors, and learn more about the college. Make sure to sign up for a date that works best for you.

SCHEDULE YOUR CLASSES

Make sure to work with an academic advisor to sign up for courses that make sense for your major and set you up for success during your first year!

PLACEMENT EXAMS

If you need to take a placement exam to put you in the appropriate math, writing, or language class, make sure to take this before scheduling classes. If you are going to a school that allows you to submit your test scores or transcripts instead of taking a placement exam, make sure that these get to the correct place.

KEEP APPLYING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Check out the college website to see if they offer additional scholarships you can apply for. Also talk with your school counselor to see if there are scholarships available from your high school. Follow CapCAN's social media for regular scholarship deadlines.

PAY YOUR DEPOSIT

If your college requires a deposit fee to hold your spot, make sure to get this in on time. If there is a financial hardship that prevents you from doing so, please contact the school and see if there is another way to hold your spot.

SIGN UP FOR Housing

If you are living on campus, make sure to sign up for housing. Each school has their own process and their own ways of selecting a roommate/s, so follow up with the housing office if you have any questions.
