Students enter the National Merit Scholarship program when they take the PSAT/NMSQT in the fall of their junior year. Semifinalists are the highest-scoring program entrants in each state and represent less than one percent of the nation's seniors.

Finalists have to have an outstanding academic record, be endorsed by a high school official and complete a detailed scholarship application, providing information about extracurricular activities and leadership positions. 
